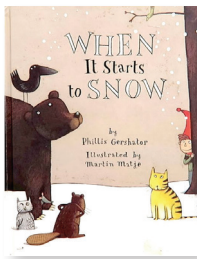


# WINTER READING GUIDE

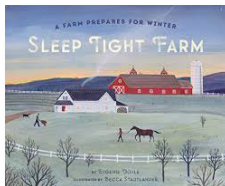
Books are adventures waiting to happen. And when it's cold outside, they are perfect adventures to have inside! Look for these titles at your local library for winter fun to have with your kids.



## *WHEN IT STARTS TO SNOW* – Phillis Gershator

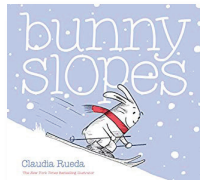
What if it starts to snow?

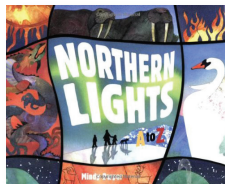
## *SLEEP TIGHT FARM* – Eugenie Doyle

Explore how a family gets their farm ready for winter, preparing from spring's new growth to summer's heat, through fall's bounty and into winter's well-earned rest.



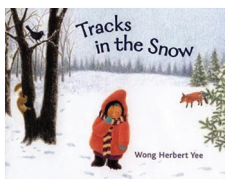
## *BUNNY SLOPES* – Claudia Rueda
